Kelly has shown an unwavering dedication to the land, waters, and people of our Band. His leadership has been rooted in both traditional Ojibwe values and innovative, effective practices that protect and restore the natural world around us.

Kelly has served the Mille Lacs Band with unwavering dedication through his work in the Department of Natural Resources since 2006. Upon his promotion to Director of Resource Management, he quickly demonstrated his ability and commitment to protecting the Band's natural resources. Now, after more than 18 years of service, he continues to play an instrumental role in guiding the Department of Natural Resources and ensuring that cultural values and traditional knowledge remain at the heart of the Band's environmental policy.

Highlights of Kelly's accomplishments as Commissioner of Natural Resources include:

- The creation of an electronic tracking system to document departmental work and impacts;
- The development of structured, transparent process for seasonal fishing declarations and permits;
- The nurturing of key partnerships with the State of Minnesota to protect walleye populations in Mille Lacs Lake;
- The expansion of hunting opportunities for Band members through collaboration with the Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission;
- Leading the Water Over Nickel initiative to safeguard our water from harmful mining operations, including the winning of a regional Emmy Award for his involvement in the Water Over Nickel short film; and
- Helping return the Cove property to the Mille Lacs Band, a deeply meaningful achievement for our people.

Finally, Kelly intends to educate Band members about enrollment issues and work with the Band's Enrollments Department to fully understand enrollment issues at the Minnesota Chippewa Tribe level.

Kelly Applegate truly embodies what it means to be a leader. He works not for recognition, but out of a deep love for our people and the land we hold sacred. I fully support his continued service as Commissioner of Natural Resources and am confident that he will keep leading with wisdom, vision, and heart.
