Corporate Affairs

A Commissioner's Order to withdraw Columbus Day as a Legal Holiday and to proclaim an American Indian Day.

- WHEREAS, under provisions of Band Statute 1001-MLC-1, Section 28, addition of Section 7.03, the Commissioner of Corporate Affairs shall have sole authority to administer, regualte and authorize all business enterprises under the jurisdiction of the Band, and;
- WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Corporate Affairs shall have the power to authorize, organize and reorganize all business related matters in the interest of increased economic development, and;
- WHEREAS, Columbus day is recognized as a legal holiday and its anticipated observation by employees of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians would be October &, 1984, as authorized by Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians Personnel Policies, section 5.10; and,
- WHEREAS: the Commissioner of Corporate Affairs has indicated that observation of that day would not be of any special significance to members of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians: pursuant to Band Statute 1032-MLC-1: section 28: and:
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of CHippewa Indians did not observe "American Indian Day" this year.
- NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Band Statute LOOL-MLC-1, Sectin 28, I, Lew Boyd, do hereby withdraw Columbus Day as a legal holiday.
- BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that "American Indian Day" be proclaimed and observed by the Mille Lacs Reservation Business Enterprise employees on October 12, 1984.
