Commissioner's Order 19-85

Administration

A Commissioner's Order to withdraw Columbus Day as a legal holiday and to proclaim an American Indian Day.

- WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Band Statue 1032-MLC-1, Section 27, the Commissioner of Administration is authorized to issue an order pursuant to his lawful duty; and
- WHEREAS, Columbus day is recognized as a legal holiday and its anticipated observation by employees of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians would be October 8, 1984, as authorized by Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians Personnel Policies, section 5.10; and,
- WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Administration has indicated that observation of that day would not be of any special significance to members of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, pursuant to Band Statue 1032-MLC-1, section 25; and,
- WHEREAS, the President of the United States in 1983 did issue a proclamation designating May 13 as "American Indian Day"; and,
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians did not observe "American Indian Day" this year,
- NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Commissioner of Administration, I, David Aubid, do hereby withdraw Columbus Day as a legal holiday.
- BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY ORDERED, that "American Indian Day" be proclaimed and be observed by the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indian employees on October 12, 1984.
