

Commissioner's Order 05-84

A Commissioners Order to close the Vineland waste disposal facility in order to protect the public health of Band members.

WHEREAS, under provisions of Band Statute 1001-MLC-1, Section 7, the Commissioner of Human Services has the authority to take such measures as are necessary to prevent any actions which threaten the well-being of Band members; and,


WHEREAS, the waste disposal facility at Vineland is in such condition as to have a detrimental effect on the health and safety of those who reside at Vineland; and,


WHEREAS, the Public Works Commission recommends that those individuals who have previously used the waste disposal facility contact Bill Boyd for removal of waste materials. The telephone number is 532-3679; and,

WHEREAS, I, Joseph Nayquonabe, Commissioner of Human Services, have personally inspected said facility and found it to be in a condition which violates the dignity of the Band,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Joseph Nayquonabe, under the authority vested in me by Band Statute 1001-MLC-1, Section 7.02 for the non-removable Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, do hereby declare the waste disposal facility at Vineland to be a public health nuisance and order its closing until June 25, 1984. I also order that there be no dumping of refuse on the side of the roads to the waste disposal facility. PENALTY FOR VIOLATION UP TO \$500.00.
