EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 100-92

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER TO IMPLEMENT AND REGULATE THE SALE OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY.

- WHEREAS, pursuant to provisions of Band Statute 1142-MLC-3, Section 7.06, the Chief Executive has the authority to act as a custodian of all Band property, and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to provisions of Band Statute 1142-MLC-3, Section 8.11, the Executive officers has the authority to perform any duties as may be lawfully assigned by the Chief Executive,
- NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Band Statute 1142-MLC-3, Section 7 and 7.06, I, Margie Anderson, do hereby order the implementation of the following procedures to declare and dispose of surplus Band Government Property:

REGULATION

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SALE OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY

Band Government Property can be declared surplus and disposed of provided:

- 1. The Commissioner under which the property is assigned shall, in writing, declare the property to be surplus.
- 2. Surplus property is:
 - a) property that is not needed to perform functions within the assigned program.
 - b) property that may not be functional.
 - c) property that is no longer needed and replaced by different property.
- 3. Commissioner shall determine what type of funds were used to acquire the surplus property. (Any property listed with United States General Services Administration and/or listed under their property control system shall be notified in writing of the surplus nature of property,

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provide no other program within the Band Government requests the use of the property.)

- 4. Commissioner shall make a determination of the value of the property at the time it is declared surplus.
- 5. Upon declaring the property surplus, notice will be given to other Band programs of the availability of the surplus property. (one week)
- 6. The Purchasing and Supply Agent of the Band may determine that the surplus property should be stored for use at a latter time. (one week to make determination)
- 7. Upon review of the declared surplus property the Commissioner of Administration may authorize the sale of surplus equipment.
 - a) Property determined to have zero value can be disposed of through a proper disposal services.
 - b) Property determined to have a value greater than zero can be sold after 10 days of public notice.
 - i. Sale can occur through sealed bids.
 - ii. Public auction.
 - iii. Through bids with an open review and sale at a set time, and location.
