RESOLUTION NO. 22 - 83

A RESOLUTION GRANTING ACCEPTANCE OF THE MILLE LACS BAND OF CHIPPEWA INDIAMS LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM APPLICATION FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING DECEMBER 1, 1983 - NOVEMBER 30, 1984.

- whereas, under the Native American Programs Act of 1974, Public Law 93-644; as amended by Public Law 95-568, the Office of Human Development Services Department of Health and Human Services has a responsibility of coordinanting programs administered by federally recognized tribes and;
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Mille Lacs Eand of Chippewa Indians is to promote the economic and social self-sufficiency of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians and;
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians is to establish an overall structure of Tribal Government through a model plan to develope legislation to strengthen the new government structure.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Band Assembly for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians does hereby approve the application for a Facilitative, Legislative Unitary-Exemplary Project to provide economic and social self-sufficiency under the Native American Program Act of 1974.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, the foregoing Resolution No. 22-83 was duly adopted at a Special meeting of the Band Assembly for the Mille Lacs BAnd of Chippewa Indians, a quorum being present, held on Thrusday, the twenty sixth day of May in the year of one thousand, nine hundred, and eighty-three, at Vineland, Minnesota, by a vote of FOR, AGAINST, O SILENT.
