

RESOLUTION NO. 10-83

A RESOLUTION GRANTING ACCEPTANCE OF THE MILLE LACS BAND OF  
CHIPPEWA INDIANS P.L. 93-636 SUPPLEMENTAL TRIBAL GOVERNMENT  
CORE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 1983.

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has available, program funds to assist tribal government to further develop their self-deterministic efforts through P.L. 93-636, Indian Self Determination Act and;

WHEREAS, the tribal government of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians desires to develop, monitor, and expand a financial core management system toward enhancing Indian Self Determination and;

WHEREAS, the development and implementation of separation of powers through formal legislative decrees which establish the rights, privileges and responsibilities thereunto appertaining to the Executive branch of government for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians and;

WHEREAS, the development and implementation of an Executive branch of government will further the self-deterministic efforts of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians.


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians does hereby approve and adopt the P.L. 93-636 Supplemental Tribal Government Core Management Program for Fiscal Year 1983.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians does hereby delegate to the Chief Executive the powers of negotiation of contract(s), amendment(s), or renewal(s) and is further empowered with signatory authority to execute said contract(s), amendment(s), or renewal(s).

WE, DO HEREBY CERTIFY, the foregoing Resolution No. 10-83 was duly adopted at a special meeting of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, a quorum being present, held on Monday the seventh day of March in the year of one thousand, nine hundred and eighty-three, at Vineland, Minnesota, by a vote of 3 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 SILENT.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto caused to set the hand of the Speaker of the Assembly and the hand of the Chief Executive to be affixed to this Resolution.
