RESOLUTION 42-83

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR AN EXPULSION HEARING OF ANY OFFICER OR OFFICIAL IN ACCORDANCE WITH BAND STATUTE 1002-MLC-2, SECTION 20.

- L'HEREAS: Band Statute 1002-MLC-2: Section 20 authorizes the Band Assembly with sole responsibility over matters of impeachment and expulsion: and:
- WHEREAS: the Band Assembly for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians has not formally established the rules of procedure for the expulsion of an official or officer of the Band.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the joint session of the Executive and Legislative branches of tribal government does hereby establish the following rules of procedure for expulsion hearings.
 - 1. The accused shall have five {5} consecutive days from the date of official filing of a complaint to prepare their response to the charges.
 - 2. The joint session of the Executive and Legsiative branches of tribal government shall convene on the sixth {b} consecutive day for the purpose of holding an expulsion hearing.
 - 3. The procedures of the full Court of Central Jurisdiction listed in Sections 3.011, 9, 13, 14, 15, and 23 of Chapter 3 shall apply.
 - 4. The two-thirds decision of the joint session of the Executive and Legislative branches of tribal government shall be final.

In accordance with Band Statute 1002-MLC-2, Section 20, we, the popularly elected officals of tribal government for the Non-Removable Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians do hereby affix our signatures to the RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR THE EXPULSION HEARINGS which was duly adopted at a special session of the joint Executive and Legislative branches of government held on Thursday, September 22, 1983 at Vineland, Minnesota.
