RESOLUTION 05-85-86

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE NAY AH SHING SCHOOL BILINGUAL/BICULTURE PROGRAM.

- WHEREAS, the Nay Ah Shing School is an Indian controlled school under the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance act of 1975, and;
- WHEREAS, Nay Ah Shing School's goal is to provide education determined by the local community that meets the Special Educational and cultural needs of its children, and;
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the Nay Ah Shing Bilingual/Biculture Program is to provide the Nay Ah Shing students with a language class designed for learning their ojibwe language and culture, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly (Reservation Business Committee) is the officially recognized and duly authorized governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Chiippewa Indians under the revised constitution and by-laws of the Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Statute 984) as amended.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly hereby gives it support to the Nay Ah Shing Bilingual/Biculture Program.
- IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we, the Administrative Policy Board do hereunto recommend the signature of the Chief Executive to be affixed to this Resolution and forwarded to the Band Assembly for concurrence.
