RESOLUTION 04-53-86

APPROVAL FOR THE PRELIMINARY LAWCON APPLICATION OF
MAY 5, 1986 FOR THE MUSEUM AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians is committed to developing a premiere visitor destination in cooperation with the Minnesota Historical Society; and,

WHEREAS, such development is dependent on providing public amenities such as a public rest area, interpretive trails, canoe access, picnic areas and nature trails; and,


WHEREAS, the government of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians will establish regulations concurrent with the proposed use of this development.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians approve the preliminary LAWCON Application and make the following commitments in support of the grant:

- 1,800 feet of shoreline will be designated and zoned for park purposes;
- All necessary trail access and easements will be provided;
- Staff resources (1,000 hours over a three-year development period) will be contributed to the planning and development of trail and park facilities.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing Resolution 04-53-86 was duly concurred with and adopted at a session of the Band Assembly in Legislative council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on May 1, 1986 at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of 3 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 SILENT.
