RESOLUTION 02-02-48-87

A resolution expressing approval for Minneapolis Public Schools to teach 12th Grade students a course on Mille Lacs Tribal Government.

- WHEREAS, Minneapolis Public Schools is requesting approval to teach and assist two 12th Grade American Government Teachers in writing the government unit allowing for Minneapolis Public School teachers to become experts in Tribal Government, and;
- WHEREAS, Minneapolis Public Schools will assist the social studies consultant to plan in-service for <u>all</u> 12th grade teachers and to implement a pilot for the unit, and;
- WHEREAS, Project staff is allowed to observe Tribal documents, such as the Constitution, Bylaws, etc., and;
- WHEREAS, The Band Assembly, before unit is completed, will have an opportunity to view documents and review appropriateness of presentation.
- BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED, That Lon Burr, Commissioner of Education for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians be authorized to act on behalf of the Mille Lacs Band in executing and negotiating all pertinent documents to fulfill this request.
- WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, That the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a formal session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present, held on July 14, 1987 at Lake Lena, Minnesota by a vote of ______ for, _____ against ______ silent.
