RESOLUTION 02-02-58-87

A RESOLUTION PERTAINING TO A REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE FROM THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS FOR DEVELOPING LAND USE AGREEMENTS.

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is duly elected governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Historical Society has received 4 million dollars to build a museum on lands held in trust by the United States Government for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, and

WHEREAS, there exist numerous land issues that need to be resolved before this museum can be built, and

WHEREAS, these land issue are very important to the future of the Mille Lacs Band's government, and


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians request assistance from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to evaluate and develop the best land use agreement for this museum complex.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the forgoing Resolution 02-02-58-87 was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of Legislators being present held on August 26, 1987 at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of 2 FOR 0 AGAINST SILENT.
