RESOLUTION 02-04-62-88

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PROPOSAL REQUESTING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY BY THE MILLE LACS BAND OF CHIPPEWA INDIANS.

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians has a responsibility to protect the environment within its jurisdiction, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians lacks the necessary resources to protect this environment, and;
- WHEREAS, the United State of America has established trust responsibility through the Environmental Protection Agency (E.P.A.) to assist tribal governments in their environmental needs, and;
- WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency has made available funding under the Clean Water Act, Section 106 to assist tribal governments, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band is requesting funding to develop and implement an environmental program, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians does not waive any rights, authority or sovereignty rights held by the Band government.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly hereby authorizes the application to the Environmental Protection Agency for funds to develop and implement an Environmental Protection Program.
- IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we, the Administrative Policy Board hereunto recommend the signature of the Chief Executive to be affixed to this resolution and forwarded to the Band Assembly for concurrence.
