RESOLUTION 04-01-35-90

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE ORAL HISTORY PROJECT

- WHEREAS, The Mille Lacs Band Assembly [Reservation Business Committee] is the duly elected governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians, and;
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians is to document the Indian culture and to provide all necessary research to record the cultural and oral history, and;
- WHEREAS, the National Parks Service has the necessary funds available to implement the project, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians is desirous in obtaining funding for the Oral History Project.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians prepare an application and proposal to fund this worthwhile project.
- BE IT FURTHER & FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Administration and the Commissioner of Natural Resources are authorized to sign on behalf of the Non-Removable Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians.
- IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we, the Administrative Policy Board hereunto cause to have set the signature of the Chief Executive to be affixed to this resolution and forwarded to the Band Assembly for concurrence.
