RESOLUTION 04-03-100-91

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ENROLLMENT OF GORDON GAIL PARR AS A MEMBER OF THE MILLE LACS BAND.

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Reservation Band Assembly (Reservation Business Committee) is the duly elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians fully authorized to act on behalf of its members; and,

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Reservation Band Assembly has reviewed the request of Gordon Gail Parr, born [REDACTED] stating that he wishes to seek enrollment into the Mille Lacs Reservation Mississippi Band; and,

WHEREAS, Gordon Gail Parr is presently enrolled with the Nez Perce Tribe of Idaho; and,

WHEREAS, Gordon Gail Parr has signed relinquishment forms with the Nez Perce Tribe of Idaho, as he surrenders all rights, title, and any interest that he may have in an undistributed property or assets of the Nez Perce Tribe of Idaho.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly (Reservation Business Committee) does hereby recommend to the Minnesota Chippewa Tribal Executive Committee that Gordon Gail Parr, born [REDACTED] be deleted from the Nez Perce Tribe of Idaho roll and be included in the Mille Lacs Reservation Mississippi Band Membership Roll.


