## RESOLUTION 04-04-109-91

A RESOLUTION FROM THE MILLE LACS BAND OF CHIPPEWA INDIANS FOR GRANTS WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WHICH ADDRESS ALCOHOL AND DRUG PREVENTION FOR YOUTH.

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly (Reservation Business Committee) is the duly elected governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians; and,
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is concerned for its enrolled members; and,
- WHEREAS, the number one priority of the Band Assembly is to improve the overall quality of life for its members; and,
- WHEREAS, funds are available through the Federal Government Office for Substance Abuse Prevention to provide programs and services to address youth chemical dependency needs.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians prepare an application and proposal to fund this worthwhile project.
- BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Administration and the Commissioner of Human Services are authorized to sign on behalf of the Non-Removable Mille Lacs Band of Chipppewa Indians.
- IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we, the Administrative Policy Board hereunto cause to have set the signature of the Chief Executive to be affixed to this resolution and forwarded to the Band Assembly for concurrence.
