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	RESOLUTION 05-01-25-92
	A RESOLUTION OPPOSING NUCLEAR WASTE STORAGE WITHOUT PROPER LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL
WHEREAS,	the Non-Removable Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe; and,
WHEREAS,	the Mille Lacs Band Assembly (Reservation Business Committee) is the duly elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa Indians; and,
WHEREAS,	under the Minnesota Radioactive Waste Management Act, Minn. Stat. Sec. 116C.72, no high level radioactive waste management facility may be constructed in the State of Minnesota without prior legislative approval; and,
WHEREAS,	Northern States Power Company proposes to store high level radioactive waste from its Prairie Island nuclear plant outdoors on Prairie Island for an indefinite number of years; and,
WHEREAS,	Northern States Power Company can give no date by which radioactive waste placed outdoors at Prairie Island will be removed from the island; and,
WHEREAS,	the intent of the legislature in passing the Minnesota Radioactive Waste Management Act was to ensure that this democratically elected State body vote on the establishment of any facility for long-term storage of high level radioactive waste in the State.
NOW THERE	FORE BE IT RESOLVED, that it is the position of the Mille Lacs Reservation Tribal Council that Northern States Power Company must seek approval of its proposal to store high level radioactive waste outdoors at Prairie Island from the Minnesota Legislature pursuant to the Minnesota Radioactive Waste Management Act.
WE DO HERE	BY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of Legislators being present held on the 17th day of March , 1992, at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of3_FOR,0_AGAINST,0_SILENT.
