## **RESOLUTION 05-03-66-93**

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO REQUEST TO THE 1993 LEGISLATURE TO ENACT A LAW PROHIBITING THE USE OF ANISHINABE NAMES, LOGOS AND MASCOTS IN ATHLETICS AND OTHER COMPETITIVE SCHOOL-RELATED ACTIVITIES BY MINNESOTA SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

- WHEREAS, the relationship between the aboriginal people of this country and non-Indian people has been marked by confusion and misunderstanding since the name Indian was bestowed the aboriginal people; and
- WHEREAS, the legacy of this confusion and misunderstanding exists throughout society today, including our educational institutions; and
- WHEREAS, one of the goals of our educational system is to instill understanding, respect and pride among learners of all cultures; and
- WHEREAS, Anishinabe students have a right to experience a positive educational environment which is free of stereotypical treatment and denigration, intentional or unintentional, of Anishinabe cultures and religions; and
- WHEREAS, the prohibition of the use of Anishinabe logos and mascots in athletics or other competitive school-related activities will help to eliminate racist and oppressive behavior toward the Anishinabe; and
- WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota can provide strong leadership in addressing the broader issue of promoting understanding and respect among people of all cultures in our diverse society by enacting a statewide prohibition on the use of Anishinabe logos and mascots for athletic or other competitive school activities.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe adopts this resolution on February 2, 1993, in support of the State Board of Education requesting the 1993 Legislature to enact a law that would prohibit the use of Anishinabe names, logos and mascots in athletic or other competitive school-related activities by all Minnesota school districts.
