RESOLUTION 07-02-140-96

A RESOLUTION OF THE MILLE LACS BAND OF OJIBWE GRANTING AN EASEMENT FOR A PATHWAY TO ACCESS RECREATIONAL PARK.

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Reservation Band Assembly is the duly elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a Federally-recognized Indian Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is empowered by 3 MLBSA Sections 2 (a) and 2 (b), to enact laws and adopt resolutions which "promote the general welfare of the people", and;
- WHEREAS, there is not access to the proposed recreational park and the best access is to continue the existing Civic Loop Road for a distance of 200 feet across Lot 11, Block 1 in Vineland Hills. Permission for such a pathway has been granted by existing leaseholder, the Mille Lacs Public Works Department on the Reservation.

The Pathway is to be 12 feet in width and motorized vehicles will not be allowed on the path to the park area.

- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe does hereby approve the granting of the road easement located in Mille Lacs County in Minnesota.
- WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 27th day of August, 1996 at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of <u>2</u> FOR. <u>0</u> AGAINST, <u>0</u> SILENT.
