RESOLUTION 07-02-134-96

A RESOLUTION FROM THE MILLE LACS BAND OF OJIBWE SUPPORTING THE PRESERVATION AND IDENTIFICATION OF BURIAL SITES PROJECT.

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Reservation Band Assembly is the duly elected governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a federally-recognized Indian Tribe, and;
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe is to identify and protect ancestral burial sites pertinant to the jurisdictions of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, and;
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe is desirous in obtaining funding for the Identification of Burial Sites Project.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe prepare an application and proposal to fund this worthwhile project.
- BE IT FURTHER & FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Administration and the Commissioner of Natural Resources are authorized to sign on behalf of the Non-Removable Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe.
- IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we, the Administrative Policy Board hereunto cause to have set the signature of the Chief Executive to this resolution and forwarded to the Band Assembly for concurrence.
