RESOLUTION 11-01-42-04

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SUBMISSION OF GRANTS TO DEVELOP THE CURRICULUM, EVENTS, AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE MISIZAAGAIGANII-ANISHINAABE IZHITWAAWIN CAMP (MILLE LACS OJIBWE TRADITIONS) A LANGUAGE AND CULTURAL CAMP

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is the duly-elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a federally-recognized Indian Tribe, and;

WHEREAS, the number one priority of the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is to improve the overall quality of life for the people of the Mille Lacs Reservation, and;


WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly wishes to reinforce the Ojibwe Culture and Language Center encampment to preserve the history, customs, values, and language of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, and;

WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly believes the Band should pursue funding from the Grotto Foundation and the Administration for Native Americans (ANA) to develop the curriculum and activities for this center and encampment, and;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly approves the application to the Grotto Foundation and ANA for this purpose.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council Assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 16th day of March, 2004 at Onamia, Minnesota be a vote of 2 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 SILENT.
