## **RESOLUTION 11-02-02-05**

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS TRANSFER OWNERSHIP OF BUILDING 101, OLD NAY AH SHING SCHOOL, LOCATED ON TRACT 410T1007 TO THE MILLE LACS BAND OF OJIBWE.

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is the duly-elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a federally-recognized Indian Tribe; and,
- tribal land leases are required on all tribal lands of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe WHEREAS. for agricultural purposes, to establish a home-site or a seasonal recreational residence, and for any commercial activity, or to acquire financing for a home; and.
- the Mille Lacs Reservation Business Committee authorized a lease through WHEREAS. Resolution 12-86 for the Community Center to be constructed for school and community activities; and,
- WHEREAS, the Community Center is located on approximately 10 acres more or less in the Southeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northwest one-quarter (SE 1/4 SE 1/4 NW 1/4) all in Tract # 410 TF 1007 described as the South one-half of the Northwest one-quarter (S ½ NW ¼) of section Twenty-eight (28) Township Forty-seven North (T47N), Range Twenty-seven West (R27W) Fourth Principal Meridian; and,
- the Community Center is currently known as Building 101, Old Nay Ah Shing WHEREAS. School on the Bureau of Indian affairs inventory, and,
- the Community Center structure is no longer a viable building and posses a health WHEREAS, and safety risk to the community; and,
- WHEREAS. The Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe wishes to have the Bureau of Indian Affairs transfer ownership of the Community Center to the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe so that the Band may demolish the Community Center.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe is hereby requesting the Bureau of Indian Affairs to transfer ownership of the Old Community Center, which is the property of the Bureau of Indian Affairs located on the real property described above; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED, that once the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe obtains ownership of the Community Center, the Band will then demolish the building.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 21st of October, 2004 at Lake Lena, Minnesota by a vote of <u>3 FOR</u>, <u>0 AGAINST</u>, <u>0 SILENT</u>.
