## **JOINT RESOLUTION 11-04-13-06**

A JOINT RESOLUTION DOCUMENTING SUPPORT FOR THE \$220,076 COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT TO THE OFFICE OF JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A TRIBAL YOUTH PROGRAM

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is the duly elected governing body for the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a federally-recognized Indian Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly has established as a priority to improve the social and economic conditions and quality of life for the people of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe; and
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly recognizes the importance of decreasing truancy, delinquency, and drug and alcohol abuse among youth, and
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe fully supports the program goals of the United States Office of Indian Education, including:
  - All students will meet or exceed academic proficiency levels
  - All schools . . . will provide a safe and secure environment by decreasing incidents of violence and substance abuse by a minimum of two percent annually
  - Student attendance rate will meet or exceed the United States rural attendance rate
  - High school graduation rates will be 95 percent or higher, and
- WHEREAS, Mille Lacs Band Assembly recognizes how drug and alcohol abuse among youth adversely affects the Band's ability to meet attendance, achievement, violence reduction, and graduation rate goals.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly does hereby supports the Cooperative Agreement with the United States Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention for the purpose of starting a Tribal Youth Program which will require youth to attend weekly drug and alcohol education classes in order to complete the program and earn a privledge to attend a culturally-relevant summer wilderness adventure camp and canoe trip in northern Minnesota.
- WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 20th day of October 2005 at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of 3 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 SILENT.
