RESOLUTION 12-03-64-07

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CRAIG HANSEN TO HIS APPOINTMENT AS A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL FOR TRIBAL EMPLOYMENT RIGHTS AND ALSO A MEMBER OF THE GREAT LAKES REGION

- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band Assembly is the duly-elected governing body of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a federally-recognized Indian Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, Craig Hansen is the current Indian Employment Rights Coordinator for the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe; and
- WHEREAS, Craig Hansen has been involved with the Council for Tribal Employment Rights ("CTER"); and
- WHEREAS, the mission of the CTER is "to assist Tribes to develop effective Indian preference laws and TERO programs to ensure that Indian and Native people receive their basic entitlement to employment, business and entrepreneurial opportunities on and near reservations and Alaska native villages;" and
- WHEREAS, the vision of the CTER is "to advance the economic and social well-being of Indian and Native people and to promote positive change and self sufficiency in tribal communities;" and
- WHEREAS, Craig Hansen has been elected to the Board of Directors of the CTER as Vice-Chairman and Alternate for the Great Lakes Region; and
- WHEREAS, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe has been and continues to be a leader in the area of tribal employment rights.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Band Assembly hereby authorizes Craig Hansen to his Appointment as a member of the Council for Tribal Employment Rights and also a member the Great Lakes Region.
- WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a special session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 8th day of May, 2007, at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of 5 FOR, AGAINST, SILENT.
