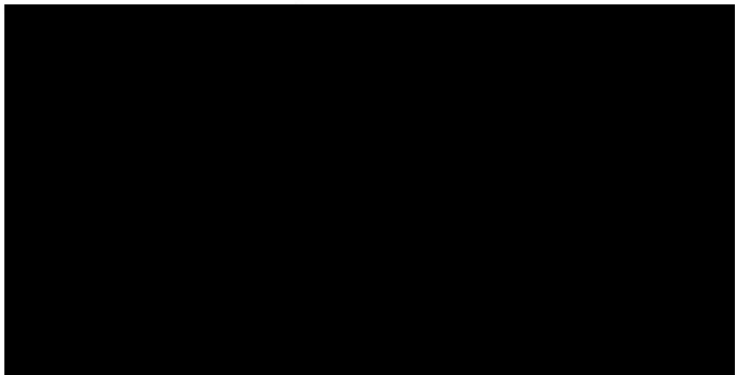
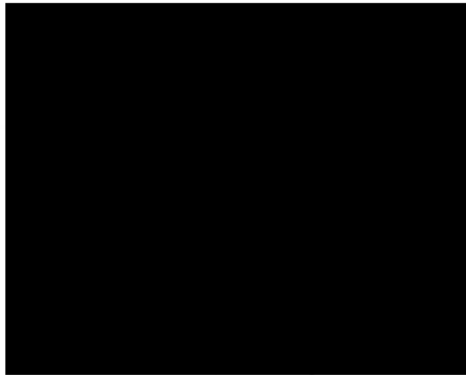



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mille Lacs Band Assembly denies the above applications for enrollment because of failure to comply with requirements found in Article II of the Minnesota Chippewa Tribal Constitution.

WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the foregoing resolution was duly concurred with and adopted at a regular session of the Band Assembly in Legislative Council assembled, a quorum of legislators being present held on the 16th, day of January, 2007 at Vineland, Minnesota by a vote of 3 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 SILENT.
